Your continued generosity to our Casa Dorinda Scholarship Fund has allowed us to grant scholarships to our growing number of applicants.

During the past three years we have doubled the number of applicant awardees.
Highlights of the 2026 scholarship season:

- Scholarships awardees represent **10 of our Casa Departments**
- **43 scholarships** will be awarded to applicants for a total of \$217,500
- **21 students** will attend **2-year colleges or accredited vocational schools**
- **22 students** are headed to **4-year universities**, including **undergraduate and graduate colleges & universities across the country.**

The scholars pursue a wide range of studies - from healthcare, education, law, to a myriad of other areas. The common link is that they have a passion for the direction they have chosen to pursue.

This was my final year as Chair of the Casa Dorinda Scholarship Committee. I am grateful to have had the honor of working with my committee to develop a wonderful response from employees pursuing their dreams. We are honored to have Steve Johnson as our new Chairman. Steve will bring new ideas for further growth to the employee scholarship community.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND - FACTS & FIGURES

Increased Awards: The Scholarship Committee recently voted to increase the \$5,000 four-year college scholarship award to \$7,500, thanks to the generosity of our donors and the rising cost of college. Through the Scholarship Foundation of Santa Barbara's application process, many recipients also qualify for additional aid - some students graduate with no student debt.

Funded Applicants: Every Casa Dorinda employee or family member who completed the application process received scholarship funding.

Fundraising Strategy: After awarding \$217,500 in scholarships this June, our fund balance is \$103,000. We are encouraging renewed support for the Annual Fund to meet our goal of \$250,000—enough to fund all eligible applicants in 2027.
